

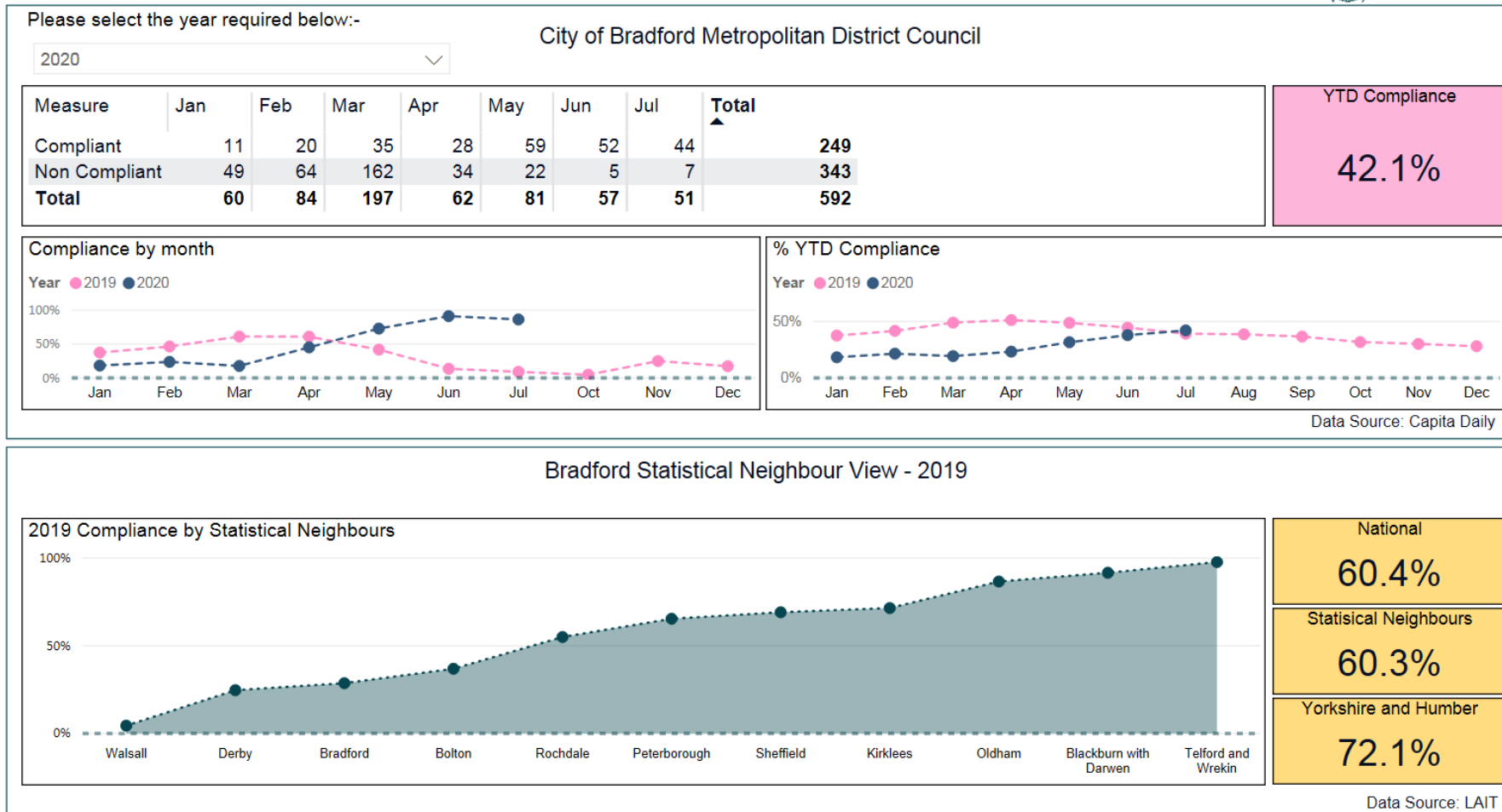

<p>20 Weeks Compliance</p> <p>Year ● 2019 ● 2020</p>	<p>Narrative</p> <p>▼</p> <p>The Compliance Rate at the end of June stands at 37.9%. This is a significant and continual increase since March. The ambition is to achieve national average in the 2020 calendar year. However the significant number of cases that were not processed in previous years and have not been address will continue to have a dampening effect of compliance rates.</p>
<p>New EHCPs Issued</p> <p>Year ● 2019 ● 2020</p>	<p>Narrative</p> <p>▲</p> <p>There was a significant increase in plans completed in March (195) due to our position of finalising the bulk of the non-compliant cases. The number of plans issued per month has resumed to a more consistent level in April (63), May (81) and June (57). The team will aim to complete a minimum of 45 EHC plans each month this year.</p>
<p>EHCP Cohort</p> <p>AcademicYear ● 18/19 ● 19/20</p>	<p>Narrative</p> <p>▲</p> <p>The number of CYP with an EHC plan continues to rise and we are expecting 10% growth per year.</p>
<p>Permanent Exclusions for EHCP</p> <p>AcademicYear ● 18/19 ● 19/20</p>	<p>Narrative</p> <p>▼</p> <p>Permanent Exclusions (PEX) for the academic year 2019/2020 of statutory school age pupils stands at 55 to date (01/07/20), 4 are still to complete the process (On capita there are also an additional 3 post 16 PEX). There are no PEX for those with EHCPs. Of the 55 excluded we have 51 secondary and 4 primary phase. Of the pupils excluded who have completed the process and come off the school roll. of which there is 51 - 1 was under</p>
<p>Persistent Absence for EHCP</p> <p>AcademicYear ● 18/19 ● 19/20</p>	<p>Narrative</p> <p>▼</p> <p>The data for April onwards demonstrates the impact of Covid-19 on pupil attendance. Absence cannot be recorded in the same way as pupils are not legally required to attend school at this time. Attendance data is being collected but Parents currently have the legal right to keep pupils safely at home.</p>

<p>CME with EHCP</p> <p>AcademicYear ● 18/19 ● 19/20</p>	<p>Narrative</p> <p>▲</p> <p>A previous 'backlog' of cases has been very nearly resolved. CME cases that are currently open are being dealt with in a more robust way and in a reasonable turnaround to allow for robust multi-agency checks with agencies such as the police, health, HMRC and other Local Authorities. There are clear procedures in place around CME, based upon legislation and guidance from the DfE. Despite this, there are still some concerns about some</p>
<p>EHE with EHCP</p> <p>AcademicYear ● 18/19 ● 19/20</p>	<p>Narrative</p> <p>▲</p> <p>The number of EHE children with EHCPs is 21 at the end of June. We continue to robustly challenge parents through the use of school attendance orders where support avenues have been exhausted. During Covid-19 this process will change, but the team will still do everything to act where it receives information that suggests a child is not in receipt of an efficient full time education suitable to age, aptitude and any SEN.</p>
<p>Children in Care with EHCP</p> <p>AcademicYear ● 18/19 ● 19/20</p>	<p>Narrative</p> <p>▼</p> <p>The number of children in care with an EHCP has remained relatively stable with a small reduction due to children who left care in the period. This continues to be between 12 and 13% of the total children in care population. All children in care receive additional support via the Virtual School and all have a Personal Education Plan which is designed to overcome barriers to attainment and reduce the gap between them and their peers.</p>
<p>CPP with EHCP</p> <p>AcademicYear ● 18/19 ● 19/20</p>	<p>Narrative</p> <p>▲</p> <p>Currently in Bradford we have 999 children subject to a Child Protection plan across the district. Of these children, 70 are recorded as having Education, Health and Care plans. This accounts for 7% of the total CP population. In the main, these children are visited once every 10 days by their allocated Social Worker and a monthly multi-agency core group is held every 4 weeks to review the progress of the child protection plan.</p>
<p>CIN with EHCP</p> <p>AcademicYear ● 18/19 ● 19/20</p>	<p>Narrative</p> <p>▲</p> <p>To date (01/07/20) we currently have 1072 Children subject to a Child in Need Plan of which 30% have a EHCP. We have just launched the New Practice Standards that ensure all plans are reviewed at the fourth month point by the allocated Team Manager to ensure the right level of support is in place. We currently have 304 children defined as a Child in need open on a EHCP plan.</p>

There continues to be an increase in the compliance rates which shows a positive trajectory from March onwards. The SEND Assessment Team have already finalised more plans this year (592 to date) than for the whole of last year (427). This is an extremely impressive position and shows the continual commitment of the team to improve.
