This is slightly down from February (21.5%) due to the large amount of non-compliant plans finalised in March. The ambition is to achieve national average in the calendar year January 20 to December 20. However the significant number of cases that were not processed in previous years and have not been address will continue to have a dampening effect of compliance rates.</p>

CME cases that are currently open are being dealt with in a more robust way and in a reasonable turnaround to allow for robust multi-agency checks with agencies such as the police, health, HMRC and other Local Authorities. There are clear procedures in place around CME, based upon legislation and guidance from the DfE. Despite this, there are still some concerns about some</p>
<p>EHE with EHCP</p> <p>AcademicYear ● 18/19 ● 19/20</p>	<p>Narrative</p> <p>▲</p> <p>The number of EHE children with EHCPs is currently 27 to date. Children returned to roll demonstrates an increasing trend. We continue to robustly challenge parents through the use of school attendance orders where support avenues have been exhausted. During Covid-19 this process will change, but the team will still do everything to act where it receives information that suggests a child is not in receipt of an efficient full time education</p>
<p>Children in Care with EHCP</p> <p>AcademicYear ● 18/19 ● 19/20</p>	<p>Narrative</p> <p>▼</p> <p>The number of children in care with an EHCP has remained relatively stable with a small reduction due to children who left care in the period. This continues to be between 12 and 13% of the total children in care population. All children in care receive additional support via the Virtual School and all have a Personal Education Plan which is designed to overcome barriers to attainment and reduce the gap between them and their peers.</p>

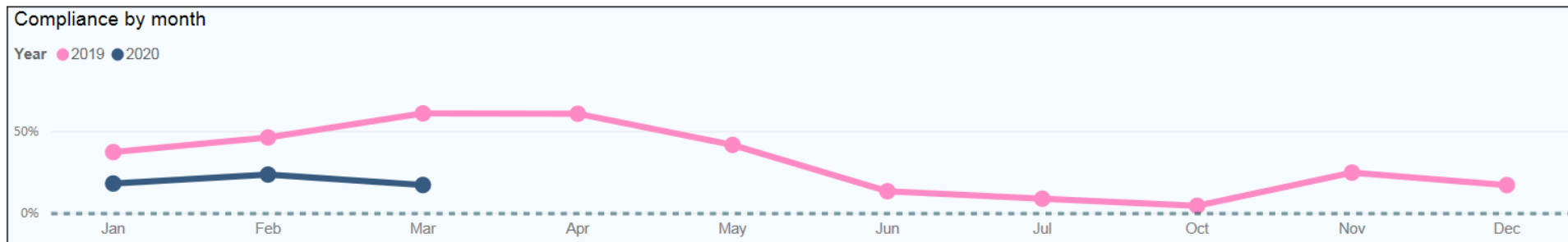
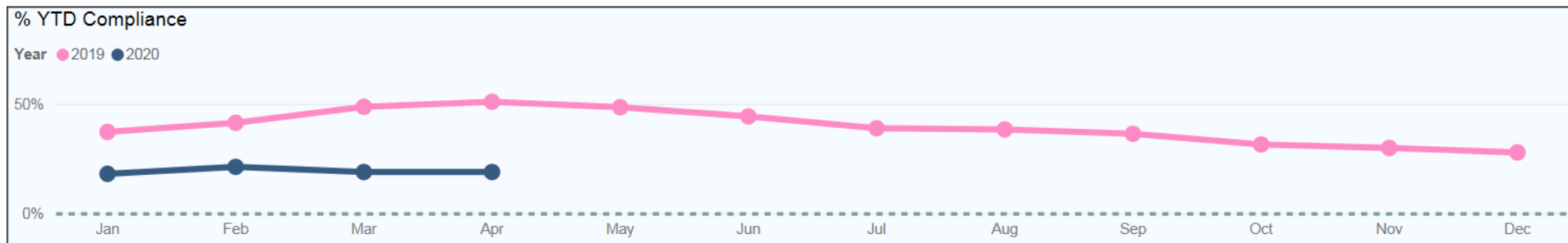

Whilst the compliance rate at the end of March was only 19.2%, this is due to the large amount of non-compliant plans finalised in March. The SEN Team finalised a total of 195 plans in March which is the largest amount finalised by the team. There has also been an increase in the number of compliant plans finalised each month which shows a positive trajectory. This is also demonstrated with 12 compliant plans out of a total of 20 completed so far in April (as of 6th April) with a compliance rate of 60% for the month to date.
